## *Why Should I Go to Church?*

Sound familiar?

Have you asked yourself this question?

Have you heard your children ask this question?

Have you ever wondered how to answer this question (either for your children or yourself)?

Well, here are a few responses to avoid:

**“Christians are supposed to go to church.”** ó If we see any part of our Christian experience as an obligation rather than a response from the heart, we’ll most likely choose not to take part in that activity.

**“Our family has been attending church for generations.”** ó We’re not a Christian just because we’re born into a Christian home. Our Christian faith is a conscious choice rather than merely a cultural inheritance.

**“It’s a great time to see our friends.”** ó Social life is a *bonus* to church attendance, not a substitute for spiritual motivations.

**“We go to church because (someone) says so.”** ó Whether the *someone* who says you’ll go to church is a parent, spouse, or the residual voice of your parents from childhood, remember, it’s better to encourage personal choice. When worship is a choice, this makes it far more likely that one will make it their own choice to worship even when that certain *someone* isn’t around to have the *õsay so.õ*

The last bullet point hits on an important distinction we all need to be reminded of ó *õchurchõ* is the building; *õworshipõ* is what we do in the building. And, worship is an opportunity for us to draw closer to the God who has drawn infinitely close to us in and through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus the Christ. Worship is a time for us to gather as faithful people to recognize God’s love for us; then accept and be transformed by God’s love for us; and in turn be empowered by that love to take the Good News with us into our daily lives.

Here is a recommended response:

**“Why should I go to church?”** ó *õWe go to church because we choose to accept God’s invitation to worship and fellowship with other believers.õ*

Or, you might recall the words of my Sunday school teacher who often quoted the Psalmist with these words, *õI was glad when they said to me, -Let us go to the house of the LORD!õ* (Psalm 122:1)

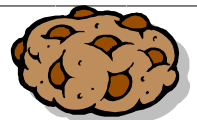
