The soup kitchen maintains a pantry of shelf-stable items for guests to take home to eat on the weekends. They are in serious need of donations of peanut butter and individual serving size canned goods such as ravioli, vienna sausages, spaghetti, beef stew, etc. make sure that the cans have tabs so they can be opened without a can opener. If you wish to donate any of these items, drop them off at the soup kitchen, located at the rear, in the basement, at Prince of Peace Episcopal Church, from 9:30 - 12:30 Monday through Saturday.

2010 Peacemaking Offering

Actively and intentionally this year's peacemaking offering will "Seek Peace & Pursue It". We will be supporting five missions involved in peacemaking efforts through this year's offering. We hope to send at least \$800.00 to each of the following ministries:

- **Soup Kitchen** - serving over 1,000 meals a month locally to those who are hungry.
- **Survivors Inc.** - local shelter and support for those experiencing domestic violence cycle or sexual assault.
- **South Central Community Action Programs**
 - **Homeless Shelter** - Begun in 1991 this ministry has helped over 3,000 people develop plans for living outside of the shelter once their stay in the shelter is over.
 - **Food Pantry** - Serving 1,100 people per month in Gettysburg and over 2,200 per month throughout all of the Adams County pantries.
- **Meals-n-More** - a summer outreach of the Soup Kitchen which seeks to serve some of our younger community members by offering a meal and spiritual formation.

In addition to the above, we will forward a portion of the offering to the Presbyterian Church (USA) to support the larger effort of peacemaking throughout the world.

If every member gives \$5.00 (over a 30 day period, that's 17 cents a day) we will meet this year's goal of \$4,000.00. Prayerfully consider how you will support these ministries this year. 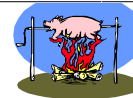

Rally Day is a great opportunity to "invite a friend to worship" as our new programmatic year kicks off that Sunday with the start of Sunday morning Christian Education classes.



BETHEL BIBLE COURSE

A terrific opportunity for a comprehensive study of the Bible is available to you this fall during the Sunday School hour. The Bethel Bible Study begins on September 12. The Bethel Course offers three seven-week studies on the Old Testament in the 2010-2011 church program year followed by three seven-week studies in the New Testament for 2011-2012. Because this course involves a study of the Bible, you will be required to do reading at home each week. We ask that you commit to a year with the group when you register for the Bethel Course. About 320 GPCers have taken this course over the years.

The following testimonial by Mary Flinner speaks to the spiritual and practical value of the Bethel course:

Reading is one of my favorite pastimes, but when my husband Lee asked me to take the Bethel class with him, I was worried because I usually concentrate on the NY Times bestsellers. Nevertheless, I agreed to give it a try. Even though the Bible can be difficult to read at times, there is something in it for everyone—war, romance, philosophy, history, biography, etc.

I had previously tried to read the Bible on my own, but found it too confusing. With Bethel, it was so much easier because a lesson accompanies each chapter and the class discussions help to clarify questions. My favorite lesson was "Jesus the Man". The course definitely strengthened my faith. Even more rewarding than the reading, however, was getting to know my fellow classmates. What a terrific group of people! The Bible may not be on the N.Y. Times bestseller list, but it is certainly one of the most interesting and widely read books ever written.
