At its stated meeting of Dec. 12, the Session:

- Approved a proposal from the Finance Committee to allow members to make donations electronically through an ACNB account. Details will be coming soon.
- Approved a gift acceptance policy recommended by the Finance Committee.
- Heard an update on pledges for the 2011 budget. Pledging has been strong, but we were short of what we need to support the full budget.
- Made a request to the General Assembly of the PCUSA to create national missionary positions, like the international mission positions we already have.

- Approved a new position of Music Administrator for the Contemporary Worship Service. Five hours/week.
- Transferred 21 members to the inactive list, most of whom live out of town.
- Discussed the possibility of purchasing the property at 31 Wall St., across the alley from the parking lot, which is available. Ralph Lambert is investigating this on our behalf.

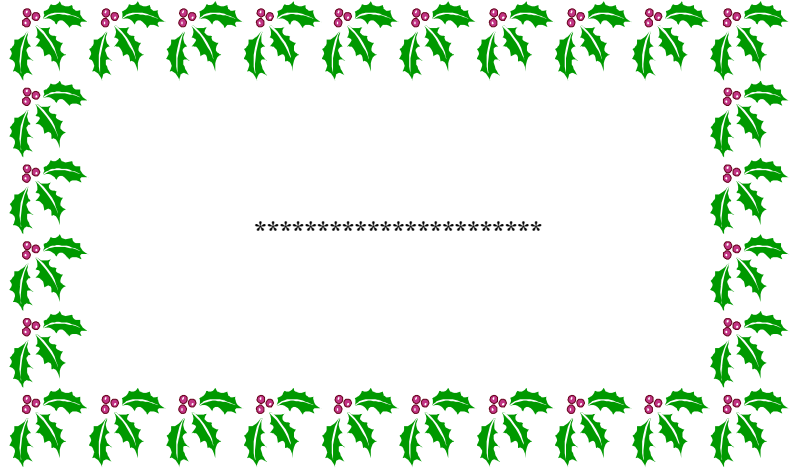
