## Prayers for Egypt & Middle East

The Moderator of the 219th General Assembly (2010) Cynthia Bolbach, General Assembly Stated Clerk Gradye Parsons, and General Assembly Mission Council Executive Director Linda Valentine write:

“Hundreds of thousands of people have staged protests in the past few days in different parts of the Middle East, particularly in Tunisia, Jordan, Egypt, Yemen, and Algeria. Today, clashes between protestors and the police have intensified to dangerous levels. Lebanon has been in a precarious situation since the collapse of the coalition government earlier this month. Iraq continues to be the target of suicide bombers and other forms of violence. The failure of Israeli-Palestine negotiations is causing many to lose hope in a political solution for this decades-old conflict.

Please remember all the peoples of the Middle East in your prayers. Please remember those whose lives have been disrupted and those who are afraid during this civil unrest. Please also pray for the governments and political leaders that they might govern fairly, wisely, and with sensitivity to the peoples’ lives and dignity.

Please pray in particular for the Christian minorities in the Middle East, as they often become the scapegoat in the midst of conflicts. Although most of the Middle East inhabitants are Muslims, more than fifteen million Middle Easterners are Christians who trace their Christian heritage back to the apostolic era. The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) has partnered with Middle Eastern churches for most of the last two centuries. Please join your hearts in prayer for our sisters and brothers with whom we have been made one in the Body of Christ.”

### Spotlight on Missions

## Spotlight on Missions- Friends of Accion

Friends of Accion is a 501c(3) non-profit organization formed to render meaningful support to Accion Ministries in the Yucatan peninsula in Mexico. It was founded in 2003 and aims to advance the well-being of the people of Yucatan and the Christian faith. A board in the U.S. coordinates donations and provides financial accountability. It also oversees the ministry in Mexico founded in 1989 by Rev. Oscar Dorantes.

Accion operates a boys shelter in Merida to provide a Christian environment for boys from the poorest villages to live in while attending school, and runs VIM – the Mayan Children's Village – a free boarding school where children live and eat during the week while attending schools which are unavailable in the villages in which they live. Accion also coordinates work teams brought from across the U.S. to help construct homes and churches (our Mexico mission team also runs a Bible school and an eyeglass clinic), and establishes and nurtures Protestant "seed" churches across the Yucatan.

Kids Club is a time of fun, friendship, Bible stories, Scripture activities, crafts, and games under the leadership of Pam Rowland. We will offer two identical programs for our Spring series, "Old Testament Characters". These programs will be held every Tuesday from March 8 - April 5, one from 3:30 - 5:30 p.m. and the other from 6:00 - 8:00 p.m. Both programs are for children in Kindergarten - Grade 2 and will be held downstairs in the MacAskill Room.

#### *Gospeled Lives: Encounters with Jesus by John Indermark*

Now is your chance to be a part of an exciting opportunity for spiritual growth and fellowship!

Using Indermark's book, our annual Lenten Small Groups will get-to-know several New Testament people who heard Jesus speak about their lives. From the book's jacket cover, "*Christ's call leads to a continually unfolding story for each of us. In this book we read about the response of people to Jesus' presence in their lives. Some responded with joy and gratitude; some ignored or rejected his word to them. Gospeled Lives are lives that have encountered Jesus Christ.
