### Lenten Leanings – 2011

In Beverly Cleary's book Ramona The Pest the lead character ó Ramona Quimby ó finds herself sitting on a bench while the rest of her class plays a game like *Duck Duck Goose* called Gray Duck. Ramona was assigned this seat by her kindergarten teacher, whom she loves, Miss Binney. The precipitating event was a hair pulling incident with Susan, one of Ramona's classmates. All Ramona wanted was to see Susan's óboing-boing curlsö (as Ramona described them) spring back into place after being let go. When the dust settled on this kindergarten conversation, Miss Binney said to Ramona, óIn our kindergarten we do not pull hair.ö Then quietly she told Ramona, óGo sit on the bench outside the door while the rest of us play our game.ö

Next door to the kindergarten, two girls, about two and four years old, peered solemnly through the fence at Ramona. óSee that girl,ö the older girl said to her little sister. óShe's sitting there because she's been bad.ö The two-year-old looked awed to be in the presence of such wickedness. Ramona stared at the ground, she felt so ashamed. When the game ended, the class filed past Ramona into the kindergarten. óYou may come in now, Ramona,ö said Miss Binney pleasantly.

Ramona slid off the bench and followed the othersí

*Even though she was not loved, she was forgiven, and that helped.*

Ramona Quimby learned a lesson in guilt on that bench outside the door to her school's playground. Guilt is an indicator in our lives that something we've done or not done, said or not said has brought pain to another's life. Guilt brings to mind those places we've crossed the line and makes us want to make amends for the wrongs we've committed. While guilt is appropriate at times, a powerful motivator and woe to the society which does not honor it, guilt is not the operative word in our Christian heritage.

Grace is our starting point. For in grace we are given an óattitude of gratitudeö which helps to see life as it might be when we live in response to God's grace, which has been poured into this world through Christ's life, death and resurrection.

As people of faith, Lent reminds us that we are not only forgiven ó we are also loved by God.

We are thankful that our help and our hope is in Jesus' blood and righteousness.

It's not in anything we could ever do for ourselves.

It's not in anything we could ever achieve on our own.

Our help is in God and God's grace alone.

As people of faith, we gather during Lent (and the other 325 days of the year) to remember that our life begins and ends with God's grace. God's grace opens us up to Lent's truer calling, which is to take an inventory of our lives and see where we might change our mind, where we might encounter a reorienting of priorities, where we might begin looking at life as it *might* be instead of *as it is*.

As we sit on the playground of life and ponder how we got here in the first place, may our focus be not so much on our guilt, rather on receiving the gift of God's grace revealed in and through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus the Christ.

For it is by recognizing and receiving God's grace that we fully discoverí

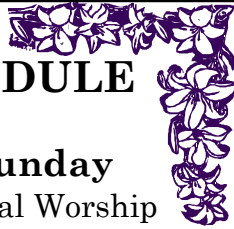
## Easter Continental Breakfast

## Spotlight on Missions Presbytery International Missionaries

We currently have 4 international missionaries on our budget; however, Rachel Sterrett has left the field, so we now support the Moores in Japan, Marta Bennett in Kenya, and the Wrights in Honduras. We focused on the Wrights several weeks ago, so this spotlight is on the remaining two missionaries.

Rev. Dr. Marta Bennett is in Kenya, Africa. She has been on the faculty at Nairobi International School of Theology (NIST) and chair of the postgraduate leadership studies. She is responsible for the M. Div. and M.A. programs with concentrations in leadership studies. Prior to her service with NIST, Marta served for 12 years with Daystar University also in Nairobi and adopted two African children. We have supported her through the Presbytery for a number of years and currently pledge \$2000 toward her mission yearly.

Rev. Dr. William L. Moore and Ann Moore have also been a long-term Presbyterian mission team on our yearly budget. Bill is the organizing pastor of a new church development of the Reformed Church of Japan in Kobe called the Nishitani Chapel. Ann, who was born in Korea, is a partner in ministry with Bill, assisting with the work in evangelism and new church development. Bill and Ann have served in Japan since 1985.
